If our destiny is to bring peace and justice to this world, are we willing to work against the injustices of unequal pay, denial of the gifts of women, lack of health care, racism, denial of rights and compassion for the refugee and immigrant population, compassion for the poor, care of the earth and the many more injustices? By receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit – fortitude; knowledge; piety; awe, wonder and fear of the Lord – we are strengthened to end the injustices. Every time we are confronted by an injustice, we know we can handle it because we know we are not alone. Today as we say "Come Holy Spirit" let us be aware of what we are asking for. Can we live up to and embrace the destiny that is ours?

On January 21, 2013, Hadiya Pendleton, a high school student from the south side of Chicago, marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, Hadiya was shot and killed on a playground back in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's childhood friends decided to commemorate her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others.

June is Hadiya's birth month and 5 years ago, a broad-based coalition asked people nationwide to join in what Hadiya's friends started for the 1st National Gun Violence Awareness Day. **We invite**

# Take Action: Continued Calls are Needed in Support of Dream Act and American Promise Act

Last week, the legislation marking up the <u>American Dream and Promise Act</u> passed out of the House Judiciary Committee. Amid the administration's multiple attempts to end various pro-immigrant pieces of legislation, such as



Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), Temporary Protected Status (TPS), and Deferred Enforced Departure (DED), these bills will provide not only necessary protections, but also a clear pathway to citizenship for the affected populations.

Advocates for this type of legislation have been working to provide information about Dreamers to showcase the benefits they provide to our communities. Just last week, the Center for American Progress released <u>State-by-State fact sheets</u> containing detailed data on the demographic and economic impacts of immigrants eligible for protection under the Dream and Promise Act. <u>Find your state's fact sheet here</u>.

We urge our members this week to stay attentive and **continue to call House members at 202-225-3121 and ask them to support the Dream Act and American Promise Act**, urging a path to citizenship for both current DACA recipients and TPS holders.
