Reflection Date: August 15, 2021 - The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

For with God, NOTHING is impossible!

The <u>Solemnity of the Assumption</u> is somewhat challenging to understand through physics. In fact there is always some confusion.

I heard a story a few years ago from one of the Friars, who I lived with.

He asked if I had heard about the class of young children who was asked by their Religious Ed. Teacher, "Who can tell me what the Feast of the Assumption is all about?" Needless to say, there was a time of silence. Then one hand went up and responded, "It

means that Mary was so holy that we assume she went to Heaven."



That student's answer, thinking deeply about Mary being so holy is why we celebrate this Feast today. Her holiness is shaped from being a first-century Galilean woman; she simply recognizes that God is doing great things in her and through her. She is the greatest sign of God working in our lives. That is the call that we hear today of becoming a disciple of the Lord. That nothing is impossible with God. God's work starts with our 'Yes.' Mary mirrors our destiny with God, if we can keep saying yes to God, we will be a part of the Communion of Saints.

The reading from Revelations gives us a glimpse of Heaven. The description of a "woman being clothed with the sun" who crushed the red dragon, reminds us that with hope we can overcome our fears, with faith we can welcome the stranger, we can feed the hungry and even allow God to change our hearts of stone into hearts of acceptance and act for those on the margins of our society.

Border communities have the capacity to welcome asylum seekers and are ready and eager to support them, but the Title 42 ban prevents this from happening.



New Report: "Climate Disaster and Protection Pathways for Migration"

Our good friends at Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS) announced the release of their new report, "Climate Disaster and Protection Pathways for Migration."

Across the globe, the effects of climate change-related disasters are exacerbating humanitarian crises and driving individuals and families to leave their communities and ways of life. For the millions of climate-displaced persons who will cross borders for safety or livelihood, there is currently no dedicated, specific legal or policy framework under U.S. or international law that affords lasting protection.

This report reviews existing mechanisms for, and the possible expansion of protections for persons displaced by climate change-related disasters. It includes formal recommendations to the administration for how the U.S. might create legal



migration pathways for those displaced by sudden- or slow-onset climate disasters.
