Dear Friends,

Having joined the Franciscan Action Network as executive director late last year, I stand in admiration of all that the organization accomplished in 2021 under the leadership of my exemplary predecessor, Dr. Steve Schneck. In 2021, FAN's work was vigorous and effective despite the ongoing pandemic, including:

- Active advocacy, joining with other faith-based groups in congressional and executive branch policy meetings, letter campaigns, and street actions to promote policies that accord with our Gospel values and Franciscan charism;
- Enhanced work on climate issues led by a new staff member, Sr. Louise Lears, SC
- Successful series of webinars on the papal encyclical Fratelli Tutti with top Catholic intellectuals; and
- Rebranding and growth of our Franciscan Justice Circles.

In 2022, FAN will redouble our efforts to be your Franciscan voice on public policy issues in the United States. Our small staff will continue national-level policy advocacy on issues related to justice, peace, the integrity of creation, and human dignity.

Beyond our efforts in Washington, we are working to find more ways to serve our broad network. New initiatives include peacebuilding and counter polarization activities as well as regular issue briefing and advocacy exchanges. Founding and nurturing Franciscan Justice Circles, local affinity groups in which Franciscan-hearted people gather to deepen their spirituality and act together for justice, will continue to be a major focus of our work in 2022.

Our Franciscan hearts—whether we are religious or lay people—are needed now more than ever in the struggle for just public policies in the United States. I thank you warmly for continuing to support FAN's efforts to serve you in this capacity. Peace and all good.







- Went from 3 circles in early 2021 to 14 by end of year with more in formation




# Faithful Democracy & More




## **FAN Financials**


