

In *Laudate Deum*, Pope Francis states, "there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, without a maturing of lifestyles and convictions within societies, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes." (para 70). Pope Francis says that even though small individual changes "may not produce a notable effect from the quantitative standpoint, we are helping to bring about large processes of transformation rising from deep within society" (para 71). What you do matters to society at large, to our nation, and to the world.

Every kind word in response to unkindness, every prayer for those who act with violence, and every action we take out of respect for people and the Earth helps create the path of hope and peace. Every text, e-mail, or letter to a legislator, every petition we sign, or every call or visit we make to our legislators helps create the path to the just, nonviolent, and peaceful world that, as Christians, we call the "Kingdom of God."

God is calling each of us to "prepare the way of the Lord" this Advent. What is your unique way to be the John the Baptist of today, to "make straight his paths" (Mk: 1:3) for others? What actions will you take today to create the path?



## **Gun Violence Prevention Advocacy Week**

This week begins a week of advocacy focused on gun violence prevention. Franciscan Action Network is a sponsor of the 11th Annual National Vigil for All Victims of Gun Violence in Washington, D.C. Search <a href="here">here</a> for a #EndGunViolence vigil near you and be sure to register your local event if you haven't.

Every year near the "tragiversary" of the Sandy Hook massacre, national gun violence prevention organizations are urged to sign a coalition letter developed by Newtown Action Alliance. The letter will be hand delivered to ALL Members of Congress by gun violence survivors who are in DC for the National Vigil and the Gun Violence Prevention Conference.



FAN has signed onto the 2023 letter which urges Congress to pass:

- 1. S.25 and H.R.698— Assault Weapons Ban of 2023 (Feinstein/Cicilline-McBath)
- 2. <u>S.173</u> and <u>H.R.660</u> Ethan's Law (Blumenthal/DeLauro)
- 3. <u>S.2048</u> and <u>H.R.4184</u> Equal Access to Justice for Victims of Gun Violence Act (Blumenthal/Schiff)
- S.494 Background Check Expansion Act (Murphy), <u>H.R.715</u> Bipartisan Background Checks Act of 2023 (Fitzpatrick), and <u>H.R.2403</u> — Enhanced Background Checks Act of 2023 (Clyburn)
- 5. <u>S.2638</u> and <u>H.R.5003</u> Break the Cycle of Violence Act (Booker/Horsford)
- S.1026 and H.R.2390 Gun Violence Prevention Research Act of 2023 (Markey/Slotkin)

# **Urge your Senators to Safeguard Asylum**

FAN joins other immigrant advocates concerned that asylum is under imminent threat. A bipartisan group of Senators is considering a deal to pass foreign aid assistance in exchange for extreme, permanent changes to U.S. immigration and asylum law. This tradeoff would destroy asylum protections for people seeking safety and would increase chaos at the US-Mexico border. Calls to Senators are strongly needed, urging them NOT to trade asylum for emergency funding. Calls to Democrats are especially important.

Welcome With Dignity offers this script. If you don't know your Senator's phone number, call the Capitol Switchboard at 202-224-3121 and ask to be transferred to your Senator's office.



Sample Script: Hello, my name is (NAME) and I am alarmed by efforts to gut asylum protections in exchange for funding for Ukraine, Israel, and Taiwan. I urge Senator (NAME) to reject any proposal that would take away the right to seek asylum or make it harder to seek protection. It is unacceptable to agree to anti-immigrant proposals that undermine our values as a country. (Can add: As a person of faith I urge you to protect the right to seek asylum.)

Feel free to make the wording your own as long as the ask is clear: protect the right to seek asylum.
