Following the Voice of Love

In John's Gospel (10:27-30), Jesus says: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me."

My daughter's softball game ended, and Maeve asked for a few extra minutes on the playground. I circled up with the other moms to catch up on the neighborhood gossip. One mom told us a story of her daughter, Isabel, having her bike stolen just two nights prior from their city rowhouse's rear parking pad. Isabel had forgotten to lock it up. Another mom in our gossip circle



was the hero of this story. She had seen Isabel's bike whizz by earlier that afternoon, easily recognizable with its pink basket and purple horn. The mom had called out, "hey kid, you have Isabel's bike." The young person stopped his joy ride, and after a brief exchange with the mom, acknowledged as much. He jumped off the bike and ran. Hearing this story, another mom in our circle exclaimed, "Don't mess with city moms!"

I giggled at that exclamation but I wondered: Really? He just stopped? Why? I mean, he was on a fast, pink getaway bike. Why stop? Why not just start riding again? Why return the bike?

Sometimes we hear a voice that arrests us for a moment— that compels us to stop and reflect. But, how often do we give up the wind-in-our hair joy ride because of mixed feelings and costs? To do so might mean we have to give up too much. But Jesus assures us of eternal life if we follow His voice. What might feel like giving up and loss is really a return to right relationship with our neighbors.

In Laudato Si', the late Pope Francis calls us to re-evaluate how private property is understood and used, particularly in relation to environmental stewardship and social justice. Property is for the common good.

Jesus, the good shepherd, do you call out to me? When you do, do I stop? How can I return to you and to my neighbor in love? What bicycle am I riding?

FAN's weekly newsletters present us with the opportunity to stop every Tuesday to listen for Jesus's voice, to reflect, and to take action for the love of our neighbor. Thanks for doing so each week!
