Reflection Date: May 18, 2025: Fifth Sunday of Easter

### As I Have Loved You

After sharing the Last Supper, Jesus focused his disciples' attention by saying: "I will be with you only a little while longer."

We read this passage on the <u>5th Sunday of Easter</u>. We are over halfway through our time focusing on the glorified Christ. Soon, we will meditate on the Ascension and celebrate the feast of Pentecost. Our lives march forward.

Can we ever put off taking Jesus' message and example to heart?



Like those at table with Jesus, our Lord always seeks to help us focus on what is most important in our lives. The words of Jesus that night summarize what should be most important in the lives of all followers of Christ: "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

The Acts of the Apostles describes Paul establishing church communities alongside Barnabas. Their spreading of Jesus' message brought new people to the church and required the appointment of helpers to carry on their ministry.

The Book of Revelation describes the conclusion of the Church's journey as "a new heaven and a new earth" coming into being where "God's dwelling is with the human race ... and God himself will always be with them as their God." John concludes the account of his mystical vision with the One on the throne saying: "Behold, I make all things new."

Just as Paul and Barnabas appointed leaders to continue Christ's mission, and as Pope Leo XIV calls us to build bridges of love and peace, FAN is taking action this May Recess by meeting with Congressional offices to advocate for just and compassionate policies. As Pope Leo reminds us, "Humanity needs Christ as the bridge to allow it to be reached by God and by his love." Join FAN in building those bridges—through dialogue, presence, and faithful action.

As we celebrate the newness of Pope Leo, let us also open ourselves to helping God to bring about a new earth through the love we share with one another as Christ's church.


# **Immigration Webinar - May 15 7PM ET**

### **Christians for Ceasefire and Just Peace**

On Tuesday, May 6, over 60 people visited all the House Congressional offices, while other Christian leaders including Just Peace fellow Eli McCarthy and FAN Executive Director Michele Dunne held a press conference. This was on the same day that American Christians for Israel held their advocacy day, calling for unconditional support to the Israeli government despite the fact that it has cut off all supplies to Gaza essential for human survival, including water, food, medicine, and fuel. Leaders said during the press conference that such measures are inconsistent with what it means to follow Jesus.

## **Franciscan Justice Circle Updates**

Members of the **NYC-Area FJC** advocated before state legislators in favor of the <u>NY For All</u> bill, legislation that prohibits New York's state and local government agencies, including police and sheriffs, from collaborating with ICE, disclosing sensitive information, and diverting personnel or other resources to further federal immigration enforcement. Also on the level of state advocacy, FJC members have continued seeking collaboration around the bill: New York Food Safety and Chemical Disclosure Act.
