The Race We Run

The <u>Feast of Saints Peter and Paul</u> reminds us that faith is not passive; it is lived, risked, and proclaimed. Both apostles faced persecution, yet they kept showing up. "I have kept the faith," Paul writes. "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength."

Last fall, I stood outside a congressional office during the Franciscan Justice Leadership Conference, nervously preparing to speak about an issue close to



my heart: protecting farm workers from heat-related illness through the Farm Bill. My great-grandmother died after not receiving medical care during a heat wave while working in the fields. I thought of Paul and his proclamation of the gospel. That's what we do at FAN: we show up, even if our voices shake.

This week, we also give thanks for our colleague Eileen DeGuire, who is stepping into a new and exciting chapter. Eileen has taught me a lot about how to show up faithfully. Sometimes it looks like reading every word of a bill, carefully breaking down complex immigration and legislative issues for our network, or reaching out to a congressional office yet again. Watching Eileen work reminded me that the race Paul talks about is often slow and steady, but we are faithful nevertheless.

May we continue that race with courage—advocating, praying, and building a Church that stands with the vulnerable and keeps going, together.

Join USCCB in Promoting Just Immigration

FAN joins the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) in raising concerns about provisions in the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act" before the Senate that double down on an unsustainable enforcement-only approach to immigration, while unjustly placing immigrant and mixed-status families at a profound disadvantage. In a recent <u>reflection</u>, USCCB President Archbishop Broglio said, "In the context of a gravely deficient immigration system, the mass arrest and removal of our neighbors, friends and family members on the basis of immigration status alone, particularly in ways that are arbitrary or without due process, represent a profound social crisis before which no person of good will can remain silent."

Reflecting on Alternatives to Bombing Iran

As violence escalates between Israel and Iran, the U.S. has joined the conflict with airstrikes on Iranian nuclear facilities, deepening a cycle of destruction. As Franciscan-hearted people, we are called to work for nonviolence and just peace.
