Reflection Date: November 30, 2025 - First Sunday of Advent

Where God is Present

"Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come."

The gospel reading for the <u>First Sunday of Advent</u> (Matthew 24:37-44), and the entirety of Advent, invites us to be forward-looking.

We are called to be awake, alert, and attentive, both to the upcoming birth of Christ and to His eventual second coming. Jesus reminds His disciples to be prepared for the Son of Man.

While calling us to be forward-looking, this gospel also invites us to be **present**. Yes, we do not know which day our Lord will come again, but we *do* know He is here currently.

God gives us the immense gift of being fully alive and present in the Holy Eucharist. Everyday, across the entire world, we have access to our Savior in physical form. He offers Himself freely, allowing us the privilege of dwelling in His presence.

When we receive the gift of the Holy Eucharist, God's presence not only remains in His body and blood but dwells with **us** as well. In a special way, God enters into the poor and the marginalized.

True to God's brilliant design and creativity, He made each of us in His image; a glimmer of Him

shines through each of us. I often wonder if I have a similar eye color to Jesus, or maybe if He has a matching birthmark to one of my roommates. Maybe His laugh has the same cadence as *your* laugh.

I'm reminded of a quote I recently discovered from Saint Augustine of Hippo:

"Do not grieve or complain that you were born in a time when you can no longer see God in the flesh. He did not in fact take this privilege for you. As He says, 'whatever you have done to the least of my brothers, you did to me."

No, I do not know the day of God's second coming, but I know the Holy Spirit asks me to be truly present while I await that glorious day. How can I live that out? I can stand up for my oppressed sisters and brothers, especially since I know God is dwelling within them. We have an obligation to speak out for them, to speak out for God.

God is coming, yes, but he is also wildly present, right here and right now.

Christians for Ceasefire and Just Peace

The violations of the Israeli-Palestinian ceasefire continue and humanitarian aid is still significantly lacking. According to <u>Al Jazeera</u>, more than 300 Palestinians have been killed since the ceasefire began.

<u>Global Priest Petition</u>: Priests are invited to sign the petition and all are invited to ask priests they may know to sign. More than



2100 priests have signed so far, including about 90 from the US.

Complicit Corporation Campaign: 45 Christian organizations have now endorsed this campaign to expose, boycott, and divest from Chevron and Palantir, which are enabling the ongoing Israeli killing of Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank. Dec. 7-13 is a <u>Christian week of action</u> focused on Chevron and Palantir as part of an Advent campaign.

<u>Contact the US Congress</u> to support the Block the Bombs act to ensure a permanent ceasefire and robust humanitarian aid.

Franciscan Justice Circles

The **Phoenix-area FJC** signed on to a letter of faith-based organizational supporters to show solidarity in protecting the sacred Indigenous site of Oak Flat (Chi'chil Biłdagoteel) in Arizona.

To protect Oak Flat, a bill will soon be introduced in Congress that seeks to protect it by repealing a previous law that authorized a land exchange for a copper mine.

In addition to attending prayer vigils at immigrant detention centers, members of the **Colorado FJC** are gathering to make holiday cards for people who are recent newcomers to the U.S. As part of an Indigenous Allies Group, one Circle member helped to organize a Three Sisters lunch with indigenous friends and allies. Some have participated in a statewide interfaith coalition to advocate for state-level legislation ensuring the right to receive visitors for those who are incarcerated.
